Liability insurance:

The society now has its own director and officer's liability insurance with Totten Insurance Group. The policy number is 100001281 and the limit is \$1,000,000.00 (one million dollars). The cost is \$973.00 + taxes (total = 1,131.84 \$).

Investment of money in CSAS matured GIC accounts:

The money from CSAS matured GIC accounts (Symposia Cashable RateRiser GIC and Conference reserve RateRiser GIC) which was deposited into the checking account in May 2015 has been re-invested.

The sum of \$80,000.00 (eighty thousand dollars) was invested in a GIC account with Industrial Alliance. I plan to invest an additional \$20,000.00 in a rate riser GIC account with Bank of Montreal after payment of this year's conference expenses.

4-H in Canada Initiatives (Nationally)



- First year of National 4-H Science competition completed with several members from across Canada competing at Dalhousie
 - ✓ Four winners were chosen from this competition to compete at the Canada-wide Science Fair in Ottawa in May as part of the new 4-H stream to the national competition.
 - ✓ Plans to expand and grow this opportunity going forward.
- 4-H Canada provided training to prepare provincial 4-H
 Science Champions
 - ✓ Volunteer leaders who will champion the enhanced inclusion of science into 4-H projects and programming.
 - ✓ Manitoba hosted the inaugural training session at our Provincial Leaders Conference in November, with plans to repeat this fall .

4-H in Canada Initiatives (Nationally)

 - ✓ Next year's theme is Environment and Healthy Living (with a science component included)

 - ✓ They will be looking for stories of esteemed members of the Academia whose story we can tell, including personal stories or research program highlights that could be shared

Discussion:

Meghan commended the EIC for a job well done. She also commented on the impact factor (IF) of CJAS which has fallen as compared to last year's IF. The reason is that the metrics used in calculating the Journal IF this year was changed and as a result, the IF of many journals went down. This is therefore not a peculiar situation with CSAS.

JAM2016 is the last time ASAS and ADSA will be holding a joint meeting so members are concerned about the dairy content of future ASAS/CSAS meetings. Meghan gave information that ASAS is diversifying and will be having meetings with various societies to ensure that specific content like dairy is represented. In future ASAS/CSAS meetings, CSAS can organise symposia on dairy, etc. Meghan also advised that it would be for the interest of the society to encourage our members to attend society meetings.

A member, Dr Greg Penner was shock that we have a MOU with ASAS on joint future meetings. There is however no such MOU in place. The joint meeting of 2017 and 2018 with ASAS was decided during AGM of 2015. Dr Penner was also of the opinion that we could consider holding joint meetings with the Western Canadian Nutrition Conference.




